Merit list and selection procedure

Merit list for **Food & Nutrition** honours course will be made on the basis of sum of the marks obtained in 'best of four' subjects plus marks obtained in chemistry in 10+2 examination(marks obtained in Environment Studies should not be considered under 'best of four' subjects).

Merit list for **Human Development** honours course will be made on the basis of sum of the marks obtained in 'best of four' subjects in 10+2 examination(marks obtained in Environment Studies should not be considered under 'best of four' subject).

Selection procedure

Selection will be made strictly on the basis of merit and on the basis of preferences opted in the application. Any candidate selected in first preference will not be considered second preference.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ORDER OF PREFERENCE

In some cases a candidate may apply for more than one course with Order of Preferences. Candidate should give her order of preference carefully; it cannot be changed later. During selection, all the options of candidate of Higher Merit will be considered first then the options of the next higher merit candidates will be considered. Once the candidate will be selected in one option, all the lower options will be closed, keeping the higher options remains open for future chance. The preference 1 is higher option than preference 2 and so on. The candidate should select the course as preference 1 which she thinks the best one and she intends to get admission if she got chance. Accordingly 2nd best course as preference 2 and so on.
