

Change of Order of Preference

It is assumed that the candidates are given their preference rightly. However if anyone want to change the order of preference once again, they are allow to do so by login in to the Admission Portal using his/her USER ID (Application No.) and PASSWORD. Before going to change the order of preference candidate should read carefully THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE ORDER OF PREFERENCE given below.

a. Candidate Preferences and Upgrades:

- Candidates submitted an ordered list of college preferences during the i. application process.
- Higher-numbered preferences (e.g., Preference 1) are considered "higher" ii. options.
- If a candidate is selected for a specific preference, all lower preferences are iii. closed.
- Higher preferences, however, remain open for future chances of upgrade during iv. subsequent phases of e-counseling.

b. Changing Preferences:

Candidates are offered one chance to change their preference order after the draft merit list is published.

c. Significance of Order of Preference

- A candidate may apply for more than one institute with Order of Preference. Candidate should give order of preference carefully; it may not be changed later. Higher preference will be open for up gradation in next phases of e-counseling and lower preferences will be closed.
- The preference '1' is high option than preference '2' and so on. The candidate should select the Institute as preference '1' which he/she thinks the best one and he/she intends to get admission, if he/she gets chance. Accordingly 2nd best Institute as preference '2' and so on.

During Selection process, all the options of the candidate with Higher Merit will be considered first then the options of the next higher merit candidate will be considered. Once the candidate is selected in one option, all the lower options will be closed, keeping the higher options, if available, remains open for future chance.
